22 August 1914

My dearest parents and my beloved little sisters,

When you receive this card, your little boy will be no longer. Doing a patrol with six men, someone fired a bullet from a few meters away and ruptured an artery in my thigh. Then, abandoned, I have waited for twenty-four hours and I went into the hand of God, where I will find you sooner or later. And so don't cry too much for me and pray for me.

Let's go! My last thoughts will be for you and for God.

I embrace you tenderly and lovingly for the last time.

Your little boy and brother who says goodbye for eternity.
