Just in its rear is the bar, 17 feet long, made of solid cherry and hand-

somely finished. Here a large stock of the best liquors in the market are always kept on hand, and are served in first-class style. An 8-foot hall, leading from the main entrance, divides the office and bar from the reading-room and wash-rooms. The reading-room is 20x30 feet, and is equipped with writing desks, comfortable chairs, etc. Daily and weekly newspapers are furnished by

the management, as well as pens, ink and stationery, for the accommodation of guests. The dining-room is 22x40 feet, and will seat 100 people. Everything in season is served here in the best style.
